• Provisional Staffing 2024 – 2025

- O Due to enrollment will open an English K5 with 8 students. There will be 2 K5 immersion classes. Currently 18 registered for K4 (max is 17); mandated to keep taking registrations until end of April.
- o Total of 25 homerooms projected (max is 26): 8 English / 17 Immersion. Staffing will adjust based on numbers. Administration grateful to teachers for flexibility in finding solutions when needed.
